- The Delaware River is really two rivers in one. It is a working river, upon which much of the area's commerce and many livelihoods depend. And it is also a living river, a unique ecological community where thousands of species live or visit throughout the year.
- The Delaware Estuary is a truly unique and treasured part of this region with its distinctive indigenous flora and fauna.
- DuPont was founded along the Delaware Estuary and now, more than 200 years later, we are proud to live and work in this unique area.

Clear into the Future Fast Facts

1. So far, the DuPont Nature Center has experienced more than 7,000 visitors.
2. To date, Clear into the Future has funded numerous grants and fellowships for environmental organizations and graduate students, totaling nearly \$600,000.
3. DuPont has donated more than 34,000 acres of land for conservation through its Land Legacy Program, including more than 1,800 acres in the Delaware Estuary region alone.
4. Clear into the Future has reached more than 23,000 students through its Professor Green assembly program.
5. DuPont volunteers picked up approximately 1800 lbs. of trash from Fox Point Park, DE during International Coastal Cleanup Day.
